



University of Oregon/Historic Preservation WICHE Agreement

1. A student admitted to the major in Historic Preservation and who holds residence status for purposes of tuition assessment in their home state, may apply for the WICHE program to attend the University of Oregon as a resident for tuition purposes only. Eligible states are Alaska, Arizona, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, South Dakota, Utah, Washington, and Wyoming.
2. To apply to the UO/WICHE program, the student must file (a) a UO/WICHE application form, and (b) a letter of residence eligibility from the certifying officer in your home state. Review of eligibility of UO/WICHE status will be made by the Dean of the Graduate School or his designee.
3. Application for continuing WICHE status will be required at the beginning of each academic year but will exclude the certifying letter from your home state. This reapplication for continuing eligibility shall include a statement of the student's degree intent (i.e., which major the student intends to pursue during the academic year) and which terms the student plans to enroll.
4. A WICHE approved student admitted into the Historic Preservation program shall continue as a resident student for tuition purposes only as long as she/he is in satisfactory pursuit of the Historic Preservation major.
5. If an Historic Preservation UO/WICHE student chooses to leave the Historic Preservation program and join another major, then she/he is no longer a resident for tuition purposes.
6. If a Historic Preservation UO/WICHE student chooses to pursue concurrent master's degrees (i.e., Historic Preservation/Architecture, Historic Preservation/Landscape Architecture, etc.) then she/he must complete the Historic Preservation degree within three calendar years from the first term of enrollment in order to retain the WICHE eligibility for the remaining period of time it takes to complete the second degree (up to a total of seven years from date of admission).
7. If the Historic Preservation UO/WICHE student chooses to pursue concurrent degrees and does not complete the Historic Preservation major within three years of the term of admission, then she/he becomes a nonresident for tuition purposes for the remainder of her/his tenure on campus.
